ENACTED by the Legislature of the Falkland Islands —

1. Title

This Ordinance is the Appropriation Ordinance 2022.

2. Commencement

This Ordinance comes into force on publication in the *Gazette*.

3. Appropriation

(1) The amount of £151,809,835 is appropriated from the Consolidated Fund for the financial year ending 30 June 2023.

AN ORDINANCE

To authorise the withdrawal from the Capital Equalisation Fund of money for capital projects.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Falkland Islands —

1. Title

This Ordinance is the Capital Appropriation Ordinance 2022.

2. Commencement

This Ordinance comes into force on publication in the *Gazette*.

3. Appropriation

(1) The Financial Secretary is authorised to withdraw from the Capital Equalisation Fund an amount not exceeding £58,689,602 for the purposes of funding expenditure of a capital nature under the capital programme as detailed in the Schedule.

(2) The authorisation given in subsection (1) —

- (a) is in addition to previous authorisations by Order or Ordinance in accordance with section 11 of the Public Funds Ordinance 1990; and
- (b) applies whether or not sums previously authorised have been paid out of the Capital Equalisation Fund.

Finance Ordinance 2022

(assented to: 9 June 2022)
(commencement: in accordance with section 2)
(published: 24 June 2022)

AN ORDINANCE

To make provision for increasing various charges and fees; exempting electric vehicles from vehicle duty; increasing the prescribed rate of retirement pension payments and contributions, childcare subsidy, family allowances and the minimum wage; and powers to charge for medical care and provide financial assistance to persons receiving care and connected matters.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Falkland Islands —

1. Title

This Ordinance is the Finance Ordinance 2022.

2. Commencement

Save as provided in section 4, this Ordinance comes into force on 1 July 2022.

3. Customs Order 1948 revoked

The Customs Order 1948 is revoked.

4. Amendment of primary and secondary legislation

(1) The Ordinances listed in the first column of Part A of the Schedule are amended to the extent specified in the second column.

- (2) The statutory instruments listed in the first column of Part B of the Schedule are amended to the extent specified in the second column.
- (3) The following amendments come into force on 1 January 2023 —
- (a) amendments to the Family Allowances Ordinance 1960 and the Minimum Wage Ordinance 2013 in Part A of the Schedule;

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(not forming part of these Regulations)

These Regulations are made under article 4 of the Air Navigation (Overseas Territories) Order 2013 (No. 2870) and come into force on 1 July 2022. These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Fees) Regulations 2009 (“the Regulations”).

Regulation 4 replaces the Schedule to the Regulations, introducing a new Part 7 that prescribes the fees payable for permissions in relation to small unmanned aircraft (also known as “drones”). The former Part 7 of the Schedule is re-numbered as Part 8.

- (a) a permit for the import or export of species included in Appendices I, II and III of CITES;
and
- (b) a certificate for the re-export of species included in Appendices I, II and III of CITES;
- (c) a certificate authorising introduction from the sea of species included in Appendices I and II of CITES; and
- (d) a certificate or statement issued under section 23 of the Endangered Species Protection Ordinance 2015.
