Taxes and Duties (Defence Contractors' Employees Exemption) Order 2022

(made:15 March 2022)(commencement:on publication)(published:17 March 2022)

I make this Order under section 9A of the Taxes and Duties (Special Exemptions) Ordinance 1987 on the advice of the Standing Finance Committee.

1. Title

This Order is the Taxes and Duties (Defence Contractors' Employees Exemption) Order 2022.

2. Commencement

This Order comes into force on publication in the Gazette.

3. Interpretation

In this Order —

"Commissioner" has the same meaning as given in the Taxes Ordinance 1997;

"designated employer" means an employer listed in the Schedule;

"qualifying employee" means a person who —

- (a) satisfies the requirements of section 9A of the Ordinance; and
- (b) is employed by a designated employer; and

4. Application

- (1) Subject to article 5, and in accordance with sub-article (2), a qualifying employee is exempt from liability under any law of the Falkland Islands to pay
 - (a) income tax on relevant income; and
 - (b) retirement pension contributions in respect of relevant employment.
- (2) A qualifying employee of
 - (a) an employer listed in Part 1 of the Schedule is exempted in respect of liabilities arising in relation to the period starting on 1 January 2018 and ending on 31 December 2018;

[&]quot;the Ordinance" means the Taxes and Duties (Special Exemptions) Ordinance 1987.

- (b) an employer listed in Part 2 of the Schedule is exempted in respect of liabilities arising on or after the date appearing in the second column; and
- (c) an employer listed in Part 3 of the Schedule is exempted in respect of liabilities arising on or after 1 January 2022.

5. Duration

Nothing in this Order confers an exemption after 31 December 2022 from a liability to pay—

- (a) income tax on relevant income; or
- (b) retirement pension contributions in respect of relevant employment.

6. Condition: returns

- (1) A designated employer must complete a return relating to the relevant income of qualifying employees in respect of each year for which an exemption is granted.
- (2) A return under this article must—
 - (a) include such particulars as the Commissioner may require; and
 - (b) be lodged with the Commissioner within 90 days of the issue of a return.
- (3) The particulars referred to under sub-article (2)(a) may include the accounts of the employer for the period when the relevant income was earned.

7. Revocation

The Taxes and Duties (Defence Contractors' Employees Exemption) Order 2021 (No 25 of 2021) is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order exempts certain employees working for defence related employers from Falkland Islands income tax and retirement pension contributions in respect of relevant employment. This Order extends the exemption to employers for differing time periods. Article 4(2) and the Schedule provide for the different periods when the liabilities are exempted. The exemptions, in any case

(not part of the order)

do not go beyond 31 December 2022. Some of the exemptions are granted with retrospective effects. This is permitted under section 9A of the Ordinance.

The Order also revokes the Taxes and Duties (Defence Contractors' Employees Exemption) Order 2021 which was made in 2021. The exemptions granted under that Order are now included in this Order, most of them are listed in Part 3 of the Schedule and one in Part 2. The exemption granted under the revoked Order will carry on under this Order until 31 December 2022.

Schedule - Prescribed coins - 40th Anniversary of Liberation

Coins (Commemorative) Regulations Order 2022

(made:15 March 2022)(commencement:on publication)(published:17 March 2022)

I make these regulations by order under section 22 of the Currency Ordinance 1987 in accordance with section 66(2)(e) of the Falkland Islands Constitution Order 2008 because in my judgement the matter is too unimportant.

1. Title

This order is the Coins (Commemorative) Regulations Order 2022.

2. Commencement

This order comes into force on publication in the Gazette.

3. New commemorative coins

- (1) For the purposes of section 6(5)(a) of the Currency Ordinance 1987, the Commissioners may arrange the minting of the coins described and specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- (2) The Schedule specifies
 - (a) the denomination, fineness, weight, diameter, quality, shape, edge and number of the coins authorised by paragraph (1);
 - (b) the tolerance or remedy which may be permitted in respect of variations from the standard weight, diameter and fineness of the coins; and
 - (c) the design of the obverse and reverse of the coins.

4. Deemed denomination of Crown coins and their value as legal tender

- (1) For the purposes of the Ordinance
 - (a) the cupro nickel Crown coins and sterling silver Crown coins authorised by this order are deemed to be of 25 pence denomination; and
 - (b) the gold 1/64th Crown coins authorised by this order are deemed to be of 10 pence denomination.
- (2) The coins specified under paragraph (1) are legal tender in the Falkland Islands in the amount of their deemed denomination.

EXPLANATORY NOTE (not forming part of this order)

Section 6(1) of the Currency Ordinance 1987 gives the Commissioners of Currency (appointed under section 5(1) of the Ordinance) the sole right to issue currency notes and coins, and section 6(3) of the Ordinance provides that only notes and coins issued by the Commissioners are legal tender. Under section 6(5)(a) of the Ordinance the Commissioners must arrange for the minting of coins in the denominations, weight, form, design and metal composition as are prescribed. Section 9 also specifies requirements relating to amounts of notes and coins having legal tender.

Section 22(a) of the Ordinance gives the Governor the power to make regulations by order to prescribe anything that is required to be prescribed by the Ordinance.
