#### **Currency Ordinance 1987**

section 10

#### Calling in of 1p and 2p coins

- 1. Section 10(1) of the Currency Ordinance 1987 provides for the Governor by notice in the Gazette to declare that any coins cease to be legal tender with effect from a specified date and for matters incidental to such calling in.
- 2. In accordance with section 10(1) of the Currency Ordinance 1987 notice is given that with effect from 1 January 2025 1p and 2p coins cease to be legal tender and will be withdrawn from circulation.
- 3. To assist with the calling in process coins should be deposited at the Standard Chartered Bank no later than 31 December 2024. Coins can continue to be exchanged after 31 December 2024 at the Treasury. Commissioners of Currency may levy a handling charge on any coin presented for exchange more than five years after the coin has ceased to be legal tender, that is after 31 December 2029.

## Complaints Commissioners Ordinance 2010

sections 5 and 35

#### **Notice Setting Allowances and Expenses**

- 1. Section 5 of the Complaints Commissioners Ordinance 2010 provides that a complaints commissioner is entitled to a daily attendance allowance of such amount as the Governor sets by notice published in the Gazette.
- 2. In exercise of my powers under section 5, I set the daily attendance allowance at £337.50 (to be paid as £45 an hour).
- 3. In addition an annual retainer of £1,000 will be paid each year.

4. Sections 5 and 35 of the Complaints Commissioners Ordinance 2010 provide that the Governor may by notice published in the Gazette set a maximum amount or rate of actual or reasonable travelling and accommodation expenses for commissioners and witnesses, this is currently the rates for subsistence and mileage which are for the time being applicable to Falkland Islands Government employees under the Management Code.

## **Stanley Rates Ordinance 1973**

sections 30 and 31

#### Charges for water, refuse collection and other services

Notice is given that charges for water, refuse collection and other services under sections 30 and 31 of the Stanley Rates Ordinance 1973 with effect from 1 July 2024 are as follows:-

- 1. Charges for water:-
- 1.1 the rate for water supplied to ships under section 30(7) is £5.27 per ton:
- 1.2 the price for water supplied to premises occupied by the Falkland Islands Government under section 31(1) is £5.05 per ton;
- 1.3 the price for water supplied to all other non-domestic premises under section 31(1) is £2.55 per tonne; and
- 1.4 the minimum annual charge for a measured water supply under section 31(4) is £37.00.
- 2. Charges for water, refuse collection and other services supplied to domestic premises ("service charge")(a):-
- 2.1 under section 30(1) £505.44 per annum; and
- 2.2 under section 30(3)(a) a reduced charge for domestic premises occupied by persons of retirement pension age or over(b) £252.72 per annum.
- 3. Refuse collection charges in respect of non-domestic premises under section 30(3)(b) are:-
- 3.1 for each small bin supplied, £145.60 per annum; and
- 3.2 for each large bin supplied, £442.25 per annum.
- 4. Septic tank cleaning under section 30(1):-
- 4.1 for domestic premises, per tank, £198.21; and
- 4.2 for non-domestic premises, per hour, £78.33.

- (a) The service charge is payable by 30 September each year but payment can be made by 12 equal monthly instalments of £42.12 with effect from July each year (£21.06 per month for persons of retirement pension age or over). The payment by instalment method may be paid by tenants of Government housing by an addition to the monthly rent.
- (b) Age 65 or over or age 60 or over if a widow or widower (Retirement Pensions Ordinance 1996 section 4).

#### **Public Health Ordinance 1894**

section 44

### Department of Health and Social Services Notice of fees and charges

#### 1. Date the changes have effect

This Notice has effect from 1 July 2024.

#### 2. Medical care and medical evacuation

### 2.1 Approved charges

For the purpose of section 44 of the Public Health Ordinance 1894 ('the Ordinance') the approved charges for medical care and medical evacuation are set out in Schedule 1 to this Notice.

- 2.1.1 Part A of Schedule 1 lists the approved charges for which any person who receives medical care of a description in the first column is liable except, in relation to charges for dental care, persons who are "exempt persons dental care" (see paragraph 2.3).
- 2.1.2 Part B of Schedule 1 lists the approved charges for which persons who receive medical care of a description in the first column are liable except:-
  - (a) persons who are 'exempt persons' (see paragraph 2.2); and
  - (b) persons to whom the reciprocal agreement applies (see paragraph 2.5).
- 2.1.3 Part C of Schedule 1 lists the approved charges for medical evacuation. Everyone who is evacuated from the Falkland Islands for medical reasons is liable for these charges except exempt persons.

#### 2.2 Exempt persons

In exercise of the powers in section 44(4) of the Ordinance, the Governor has exempted from the approved charges persons whose place of ordinary residence is the Falkland Islands at the time the medical care is provided and who:-

- 2.2.1 are Falkland Islanders within the meaning of the Immigration Ordinance 1999:
- 2.2.2 have leave to enter the Falkland Islands under sections 9(3), (4) or (5) of the Immigration Ordinance 1999 (diplomats, the Governor, UK civil servants, serving members of UK armed forces and their dependents);
- 2.2.3 have leave to enter the Falkland Islands under section 15 of the Immigration Ordinance 1999 (refugees etc.); or

#### 2.2.4 have:-

- (a) a permanent residence permit;
- (b) a work permit and section 44(2)(e) of the Ordinance does not apply;
- (c) an accompanying dependent permit and section 44(2)(f) of the Ordinance does not apply;
- (d) a dependent permit; or
- (e) a carer permit.

#### 2.3 Exempt persons – dental care

In exercise of the powers in section 44(4) of the Ordinance, the Governor has exempted from the approved charges for dental care listed in Part A of Schedule 1 persons whose place of ordinary residence is the Falkland Islands at the time the dental care is provided and who:-

- 2.3.1 are children who are in full time education and are under the age of 19;
- 2.3.2 are persons of the age at which persons become entitled to claim a retirement pension under section 4 (1) of the Retirement Pensions Ordinance 1996; or
- 2.3.3 are persons in receipt of income support or attendance allowance under the Financial Assistance Ordinance 2023.

### 2.4 Requirement for health insurance or an employer indemnity

2.4.1 Holders of visitor permits, volunteer permits, work permits for 9 months or less to which regulation 16(5) of the Immigration (General) Regulations 2021 applies or any other permit issued under the Immigration Ordinance 1999 that is conditional on having health insurance must have health insurance (within the meaning of the Immigration (General) Regulations 2021).

Any person to whom paragraph 2.4.1 applies must provide details of their health insurance or other evidence of the ability to pay the approved charges before medical care is provided.

2.4.2 Employers of seafarers and aircrew who, in the course of their employment, have leave to enter under section 9(1) (shore leave for seafarers etc) or 14 (entry in emergency) of the Immigration Ordinance 1999 must provide an indemnity in respect of the approved charges for which their employees may become liable under this notice before medical care is provided.

The indemnity may be provided by a local agent on behalf of the employer.

2.4.3 In relation to a work permit holder working for an employer who has a contract with the UK Ministry of Defence ('MOD'), the employer is liable to indemnify the work permit holder for approved charges in accordance with contractual arrangements with MOD.

#### 2.5 Reciprocal agreement

The approved charges for medical care do not apply to any person to the extent that person would be entitled to receive such medical care under the UK National Health Service free of charge. Medical evacuation is not within the scope of the reciprocal agreement.

#### 2.6 Waiver of charges

The Governor in Council has discretion to waive all or a part of the approved charges. Discretion will usually only be exercised in cases of real hardship.

#### 3. Testing food and drink

For the purposes of section 13A of the Ordinance the charges for public health testing of food and drink carried out at the request of a person wishing to sell food and drink for human consumption are £71.30 for the actual inspection to be carried out and £49.00 per test with the exception of Legionella detection and enumeration tests which are £98.00 per test.

#### 4. Ship sanitation

For the purposes of regulation 32 of the Public Health (Ships) Regulations 2010, with effect from 1 July 2024 the charges under regulation 31 of the Regulations for inspection of a ship in

connection with the issue of a Ship Sanitation Certificate are  $\pounds 654.70$ .

#### 5. Health records

For the purposes of section 3(4) of the Access to Health Records Ordinance 1995, with effect from 1 July 2024 the charges for providing a copy or extract of a health record are listed in Schedule 2. The cost of postage (if applicable) may be charged in addition.

## 6. Other services provided by the Department of Health and Social Services

Other services provided by the Department of Health and Social Services that are not medical care provided under Part IV of the Ordinance are charged in accordance with Schedule 3.
