Maritime Ordinance 2017

5 January 2024

section 238

Appointment of Inspector and Surveyor of Ships

- 1. Section 238 of the Maritime Ordinance 2017 ("the Ordinance") provides that the Governor may appoint an inspector of ships, a surveyor of ships and a surveyor general, in accordance with and for the purposes of the Ordinance.
- 2. In exercise of my powers under section 238, I appoint **David Ian Fuller**:-
- (a) an inspector of ships in accordance with section 238(1);
- (b) a surveyor of ships generally, as both ship surveyor and engineer surveyor in accordance with section 238(2); and
- (c) a surveyor general of ships in accordance with section 238(5).
- 3. This appointment is made in accordance with and for the purposes of the Ordinance and the Maritime Labour Ordinance 2019.
- 4. As an inspector of ships, ship surveyor, engineer surveyor and surveyor general David Ian Fuller must:-
- (a) discharge the duties and functions specified by the Falkland Islands Maritime Authority; and
- (b) discharge those duties and functions in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance, the Maritime Labour Ordinance 2019 and any other relevant enactment in force in the Falkland Islands.
- 5. This appointment has effect from 1 February 2024 whilst David Ian Fuller is contracted as maritime consultant by the Falkland Islands Government, unless terminated sooner.

Retail Prices Index

The Retail Prices Index for the quarter ended 31 December 2023 has now been completed.

The Index has increased by 0.2% to 123.441. The change in the Index over the year to 31 December 2023 has been +1.4%.

The majority of inflation data for the final quarter of 2023 came in lower than expected, marking a big drop from peak levels seen in quarter 4 2022. The Index has increased by 0.2% to 123.441, while

the change in the Index over the year to 31 December 2023 was a mere +1.4%. The data points to a notable moderation in the pace of inflation compared to the previous quarters. More specifically, much of the annual growth is attributed to continued price growth in food and non-alcoholic beverages (albeit less so than in the previous quarter) in addition to restaurants and hotels. Meanwhile, the bulk of the quarterly growth is linked to continued increases in the categories of 'transport' and 'restaurants and hotels'. Interestingly, the largest downward contribution to both annual and quarterly inflation rates came from the 'fuel and power' category during quarter 4.

With the large energy price rises 'falling out' of the Stanley Retail Prices Index basket, the drivers of moderate inflationary pressures have shifted towards rising prices for food, non-energy goods and services. Among all components, 'food and non-alcoholic beverages' was the most significant contributor to the latest annual inflation figure, coming in at +1.5% in the final quarter while the largest upward contributions to the quarterly change came from two divisions, most notably 'transport' and 'restaurants and hotels' (+0.5% and +0.4% respectively).

Energy prices continued to edge lower in quarter 4. According to the Stanley Retail Prices Index results, the price growth recorded in 'fuel and power', is markedly less dominant compared to the previous three quarters; contributing -0.6% to quarterly inflation and -1.8% to annual inflation. (Note that vehicle fuel is recorded under 'transport', rather than 'fuel and power'). Electricity price growth contributed -0.5% to annual inflation, compared with +1.4% in the third quarter of 2023 (an average rate of +2.1% during the first half of 2023) while the quarter-on-quarter growth also turned negative during the quarter. Clearly, the peaks witnessed in the last quarter of 2022 have declined significantly. The kerosene sub-index (year-on-year) is 11.8% lower than the quarter 4 2022 price, while the diesel sub-index (year-on-year) saw a -22.3% gain on the price 12 months ago.
