Wildfire Awareness

A camping fire not a "Camp Fire"



Fire Precautions

White grass and shrubs are easily ignited, especially during warm, dry weather. This can lead to the vast destruction of the area. No one likes a **camp fire**. You can **prevent** it by following this guidance:

Open fires:

- Build your fire **away** from grass, twigs and bushes
- Build your fire in a **designated** fire pit, away from your tent
- Ensure the fire is **completely out** before going to sleep
- Never leave a fire unattended
- Always have a bucket of earth, sand or water close by
- Ensure the area around your fire is clear to step away leave no tents or clutter
- Make sure you **follow** the **instructions** of any camping stoves





BBQs:

- Stability is essential; ensure you choose a strong, sturdy BBQ
- Always check the condition of your BBQ
- Place your BBQ on level ground away from any vegetation, fences or buildings
- Never light your BBQ in an enclosed space
- Never use flammable liquids to start your BBQ or fire
- Never leave children unsupervised near a BBQ
- Use long handled tools to prevent burns
- Be careful of steam when opening foiled parcels
- **Do not** move your BBQ until it has cooled
- Never bury your BBQ under sand; it remains hot for several hours and could cause significant injuries and burns

Smoking:

- Avoid smoking in white grass or shrubby camp in summer; there is a high fire risk
- Never throw your cigarettes out of car windows or on the ground
- Ensure cigarettes are put out and placed in a bin



General BBQ tips:

Barbecuing should be **fun**, and will be **safe** if you prepare properly:

- Always ask for landowner's permission
- Always take your rubbish home for disposal or use a bin provided
- **Take particular care** in warm, dry weather
- Ensure disposable BBQs and coals have cooled properly before placing them in a bin
