The initiative prioritises environmental restoration, economic opportunities for local communities, and long-term ecological sustainability. Key issues to address in the development of a programme include public perceptions of land use, support for restoration activities, payment mechanisms, and community engagement preferences.

The goal of the survey is to develop a baseline from which to initiate a *co-design process*.
